ART GLASS RESTORATION—ACT II

The Bradley House Art Glass Restoration Project continues to progress for Wright In Kankakee. Act II is now complete in the Dining Room and was made possible through the generosity of Rick and Patti Manuel, active Bradley House volunteers since 2010.

Art glass craftsman Jesse Mulligan used vintage photographs to make the template from which two exact replicas of the original glass panels were recreated. The panels were recently installed in the china cabinet doors. The exquisite details of the glass enhance the elegance of the room. Now in

place, they are being enjoyed by all who visit the Bradley House.

ACT III, now in production, is the restoration of the four Living Room bookcase panels thanks to a donation from Karen

This spring, Ellen began a new role coordinating volunteers so interpreters and gift shop workers are scheduled for tour times.




